The Collateral Legal Assistance for Survivors (CLAS) Project is seeking two (2) interns to join our team for the Fall 2019 semester. Ideally, internship candidates will have experience working with victims and survivors of intimate partner and/or sexual violence in some capacity, or have a strong interest in social work or family law practice related to high-conflict family dynamics and domestic violence. Both undergraduate and graduate students are encouraged to apply. A high level of maturity is required.

Internship duties may include, but are not limited to: accompanying attorneys and clients to court, maintaining paperwork and files, assisting with case preparation and legal strategy, providing limited counseling and managing referrals for clients, researching and reporting on relevant topics or case law, and compiling data and information for the project.

Interns are expected to commit 10 to 15 hours per week. Unfortunately, due to limited resources, funding is not available for these internships. However, the CLAS project values a strong team-based environment and will work hard to ensure that you gain valuable learning and experience from your internship placement. Hours are flexible and part-time applicants are encouraged to apply.
