Dear Jessica,

As Annapolis is awash in the color green today – I can't help but wonder, what bills have seen a GREEN vote this week?

I am happy to report a number of our priority bills have seen significant movement!

Both the House and Senate versions of Declaration of Rights - Right to Reproductive Freedom (HB 705/SB798) have passed their initiating chambers in identical form, which means we are all but assured to see a ballot measure adding reproductive freedom to our state constitution in 2024. I am so grateful not only to the legislative leaders who made this happen, but to all of you who emailed and called to hold elected officials accountable on this issue!

Significantly, in the past 48 hours we saw a great deal of movement on <u>SB129 - Criminal Law - Sexual Crimes - Repeal of Spousal Defense</u>, where it not only passed out of Committee but also passed second reader on the Senate floor. As the bill has already passed the House, today's third reader is the last step in finally ensuring that married people have the same rights and protections against rape as unmarried couples have.

Another bill we have been waiting to see pass out of the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee finally had its moment yesterday when <u>SB 36 - Family Law - Grounds for Divorce</u> received a favorable report. This bill has also passed through the House, and is now that much closer to becoming law.

As for the Reproductive Rights Package of 2023, the Reproductive Health Protection Act (aka the Shielding Bill) has passed out of Committee in the Senate, but is awaiting a vote in the House, and the bill to ensure public universities have reproductive health plans in place (HB477/SB341) is in the same posture. Meanwhile, the Patient Privacy bill (HB812/SB786) has been voted out favorably from both the House and Senate committees and now will go to second reader in each chamber.

So what is left? Plenty!

And legislators will be working around the clock for the next few days trying to move as many bills out of Committee, through the floor, and across the street! Here are some bills that really need your attention. Scroll down below my signature for easy links to get your message where it needs to go.

SB292 - <u>Criminal Law - Victims of Child Sex Trafficking and Human Trafficking - Safe Harbor and Service Response</u>

This desperately needed legislation would protect children who have been trafficked from being charged with prosecution and other crimes related to the trafficking. It has also passed the House and is awaiting a vote in the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee.

HB283/SB 460 - Maryland Medical Assistance Program - Gender-Affirming Treatment (Trans Health Equity Act)

For over fifty years the Women's Law Center has been a leading voice in the fight for women's rights and gender equity. And when we say women, that always includes transgender women, because transgender women are women. As women, we all deserve the same access to physical safety, economic security, and bodily autonomy. This legislation seeks to address one of the greatest disparities faced by the Trans community by requiring Medicaid to cover medically necessary gender-affirming care. The House version is up for THIRD READER TODAY and the Senate version was up for a vote last night but was laid over until TODAY! There have been attempts to add harmful amendments to this bill but it needs to be passed out CLEAN with NO AMENDMENTS.

HB549/SB555 Fair Wage Act of 2023

Working families cannot wait several more years for their salaries to catch up to the cost of living. This bill will accelerate the timeline of increasing the minimum wage so that all affected workers will be making \$15 by the end of this year. This will partially make up for the rising cost of living we have seen since the pandemic. It is on THIRD

READER in the Senate TODAY and is awaiting a vote in the House Economic Matters Committee.

HB 988/SB828 - Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program - Modifications

The passage of the Time to Care Act in 2022 was a historic victory for Maryland workers and their families - but it was just the first step in realizing Paid Family and Medical Leave in Maryland. The critical work to create and implement an accessible, equitable, and robust FAMLI program is the next major step in fulfilling the promise of the Time to Care Act of 2022, and this legislation will create the parameters necessary to put the program firmly on the path toward successful implementation. The Senate bill is on THIRD READER TODAY and the House bill has yet to be voted out of Committee.

HB 832 - <u>Labor and Employment - Equal Pay for Equal Work - Wage Range</u> Transparency

Equal Pay Day was this week and by passing this bill the legislature would help close the gender pay gap by requiring that all job listings include the salary range available for the position. It is awaiting a Committee vote.
