Imagine a world where women did not have to return to work 10 days after giving birth (the average in the US), or where men could take the time off they needed to care for their partners who are ill.

Imagine not having to worry about losing your income on top of having to worry about the health of an ailing parent or child.

Imagine how many families would be better off right now, or how many workers would still have their jobs right now, if we had Paid Family Leave in Maryland throughout the pandemic.

Today the Senate will hear <u>SB 275 Labor and Employment – Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program – Establishment (Time to Care Act of 2022)</u> a piece of legislation that is long overdue.

By utilizing a system very similar to unemployment insurance, the Family and Medical Leave Insurance Program (FAMLI) will allow workers to take the time off they need to care for themselves or their family members, without fear of losing their jobs or their paychecks.

The <u>House version</u> of Time to Care will be heard next week, along with<u>another version</u> of the bill sponsored by the Chair of Economic Matters, <u>CT Wilson</u>. We are supporting *both* bills, as they both ensure that *all* working Marylanders receive not just job protection to take the time off that they need, but also the continued financial security they need to take it. Regardless of which version gets passed, we are grateful to the sponsors, <u>Senator Antonio Hayes</u> and <u>Delegate Kris Valderrama</u>, who have championed this bill for the past several years. And for our coalition leaders at <u>Time to Care</u>.

But the work won't stop after the bill hearings are held. In fact, that is when we need YOU the most! There are 3 easy things you can do to help make sure no one is left choosing between their family's health and their paycheck:
