Listen. Engage. Advocate

"I'm here to state unequivocally that one's marital status should never define one's ability to control their own bodily autonomy."

This was the opening for the WLC's testimony this week before the House Judiciary Committee on <u>HB153</u> - Criminal Law - Sexual Crimes - Repeal of Spousal Defense, a bill aimed at ensuring that married individuals have the same rights and protections as unmarried people when it comes to sexual assault

Unbelievably, Maryland laws still allow marriage to serve as a complete defense to some sex crimes, meaning that a survivor of sexual assault who is married to the perpetrator has less legal recourse than an unmarried victim. This bill is crucial for domestic violence and sexual assault survivors to be safe in their homes and receive the justice they deserve for the crimes against them. The idea that rape or sexual assault is tolerated because the parties are married is insulting, dangerous, and based on arcane beliefs that women belong to their husbands. The time has come to make sure we change the law in Maryland.

The House passed this bill last year and we hope will do so again this year. All eyes now turn to the Senate Judicial Proceedings where the bill hearing will be held on Tuesday. We will keep you updated on when committees expect to vote on this important legislation. Another critical bill that has already been heard this session, and needs your support, is <u>SB 31 - Public Information Act - Inspection of Records From Body-Worn Digital Recording Devices</u>, which would deny inspection or copying of the part of a body-worn camera recording that depicts victims of intimate partner violence or sexual assault. While the WLC fully supports transparency and accountability in government, we have seen first hand how damaging, scary, and dangerous allowing unfettered access to body-worn camera footage can be. It has been our experience that abusers are able to access those videos and use them as yet another source of abuse and intimidation. This legislation strikes the balance between transparency and victim safety. You can read our full written testimony here.
