# HB191 The Healthy Start Bonding Program

will allow incarcerated women who give birth the ability to bond with their newborn child. Currently, mothers are separated from their newborns in 48 hours. This forced separation is harmful for both mother and infant. HB191 allows women who are on prerelease status to reside with their child in the prerelease unit for up to a year.

### SB753 Public Safety-Firearm Background Checks, Victim Notification



#### SB475 - Center for Firearm Violence Prevention- will

create the Center for Firearm Violence Prevention within the Maryland Department of Health. The goal is to treat firearm violence as a public health crisis. The Center will partner with federal, State, and local agencies and all affected communities. The center will work with all these stakeholders to reduce firearm violence in our State.

SB481 Renter's Rights and Stabilization Act addresses the many issues involving tenants' rights and costs associated with eviction proceedings in the District Courts. The eviction filing fees would be increased, and the courts would be prohibited from assigning those costs to the tenants. The bill also creates a fund to pay for tenants' legal representation at eviction proceedings.

Combating eviction fees and costs is essential for women, especially victims of domestic violence, who often face financial instability and housing insecurity as they work toward safety and stability.
