

## Celebrating 50 Years of Advancing Justice

Dear Jessica,

The WLC has proudly been a member of the Maryland Fight for Fifteen coalition for several years. And we were thrilled when legislation passed in 2019 that would raise the minimum wage for workers to \$15/hour by 2025. But since then, between the pandemic and the subsequent economic downturn and rise in inflation, working families who could least afford it have been hit the hardest.

That is why we have been supporting The Fair Wage Act which will raise the minimum wage by October 1, 2023 and index it to the cost of living. This is essential to provide predictability to businesses and a fair wage to workers. The Fair Wage Act will help struggling workers keep up with the rising cost of living and boost consumer spending.

The Senate version, <u>SB555</u>, has passed the Senate but now sits in the House Economic Matters Committee, along with the cross-file <u>HB549</u>, which was never voted on in Committee.

The coalition is calling on folks who support a fair wage for Maryland workers to reach out to Economic Matters and call for the Fair Wages Act to be voted on - AS IS, with NO AMENDMENTS. Click **HERE** to send that message directly to legislators.
