Dear Jessica,

Today we celebrate and remember the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King. And while state and federal government agencies are closed in recognition, the Maryland General Assembly will convene this evening to continue the important work of this legislative session.

Among the bills being heard in committee on Thursday this week is <u>House Bill</u> <u>13 - Hate Crimes – Civil Remedy</u>. This legislation, if passed, would create a private civil right of action for victims of hate crimes, allowing for both economic and non-economic damages. In addition to deterring criminal activity, they possess important symbolic meaning that signals to targeted communities that the government cares and that law enforcement will take their concerns seriously.

The second significant bill being heard this week, <u>House Bill 4 – Criminal</u> <u>Law – Sex Crimes – Repeal of Spousal Defense</u>, is one of the most significant bills related to sexual assault and physical safety. For the past four years, the WLC has stood beside the Maryland Coalition for Sexual Assault and other partners to fight for the repeal of an archaic law that allows marriage to serve as a complete defense to some sex crimes. Sexual assault violates a woman's bodily integrity, freedom, and self-determination; the harm is not mitigated because the rape occurred in her marriage bed, but rather is compounded. It is beyond time to end this offensive practice.

There are already almost 300 bills that were pre-filed and awaiting a bill hearing. As we continue through January, we know that number will grow exponentially. Among those already filed are bills related to child custody, employment accommodations, and incarcerated women. We also know to expect a package of bills related to reproductive health and abortion, the gender pay gap, and gun safety for victims of domestic violence.

As each bill is heard in committee, we will need each of you to contact the members of the committee and let them know that you care about the issue. See below for the committee information for this week's bills and keep following our alerts for upcoming bill hearings.
