Dear Jessica,

Another small bill that could give us a lot of useful information in how to protect survivors is HB3 - Maryland State Police Gun Center - Firearms Surrendered Under Final Protective Orders (Sponsor: Delegate Bartlett (Judiciary Committee)). This bill seeks to address a concern that domestic violence advocates have long held that respondents in final protective orders are not surrendering all of their firearms as required to do by law. Protective orders are one of the most important tools that victims of domestic violence use to enhance their safety. Every final protective order requires the respondent to surrender their firearms to law enforcement. This bill would not change any of the existing laws regarding who, how, or when firearms are surrendered after the issuance of a final protective order.

House Bill 3 simply establishes a tracking mechanism to enable law enforcement to determine whether our current system of protective order gun surrendering is effective. If enacted, this bill will give us data about whether Maryland is effectively getting firearms out of the hands of respondents in final protective orders. We cannot address what we do not know, and this bill will give us the information necessary to determine if further changes are needed.

On the other hand, sometimes you need bigger changes to existing law, and <u>HB14 - Family Law - Grounds for Divorce</u> (Sponsor: Delegate Atterbeary (Judiciary Committee)) will bring much needed revisions to our existing family law infrastructure. This is not the first year this bill has been introduced, but hopefully the time is right for this update.

Finally, we continue to support our partners at MCASA and MNADV in the fight to ensure stable funding and efficient grant administration for victim-services organizations. While SB148 - Victim Services Programs - Supplementing Federal Funding and Support (Victim Services Stabilization Act) (Sponsor: Senator Guzzone (Budget & Taxation Committee)) might not be designed to help survivors directly, without the critical funding provided by VOCA and the Governor's Office of Crime Prevention, Youth, and Victim Services, many organizations - including the WLC - would not be able to continue the important services that are so necessary for survivors to thrive.
